Submissions Due: March 16th for the March 19th Meeting / April 13th for April 16th Meeting

Members are invited to share up to five (5) nature-related images at the upcoming meetings. For those members who would like a little inspiration for Show and Share, we offer a suggested topic each month. These are suggestions only, and you may show any nature related images. *March Theme: Nature in Black and White / April Theme: Spring Colors*

To submit for Show and Share:

- Resize your images so vertical images are 1,800 pixels high and horizontal images are 1,800 pixels wide.
- Name your images according to the directions at monep.org under tips.
- Save your images as .jpg files.
- Compress your five resized images into a zip file.
- Attach the zip file to an email addressed to share@monep.org by midnight Saturday, March 16th for the March meeting and April 13th for the April meeting.

March 19th Meeting – Rich Lasage

Rich Lasage, Vice President of Education for St. Louis Audubon will help us put this long winter behind us, by focusing on spring. He will continue with the story from our January meeting as he talks more about tree sap flowing and the interaction of certain species of birds with the sap. He will also highlight Missouri owl species. Finally, he will share his experience as a member of the Volunteers-In-Parks (VIP) program of the National Park Service, where for several years he worked as a volunteer at Great Sand Dunes National Park and Preserve.

Rich is a retired cartographer, African analyst, and United States Coast Guard Officer. Since he retired he has volunteered at Shaw Nature Reserve, the Missouri Botanical Garden and the St. Louis Science Center as well as at Great Sand Dunes.

April 16th Meeting – Richard Day

Richard Day returns to MoNEP to present An Introduction to Drone Photography at our April 16th meeting. His program will cover basic information to consider when purchasing and learning to fly drones, such as different types of drones, extra equipment that's necessary or nice to have, apps for drone photography, and FAA rules and regulations related to drones. He'll also show photos taken with his drone and share composition tips and techniques and how a drone perspective differs from ground photography. expand your photography creativity to new heights.

Richard is a MoNEP member and a professional photographer who has been publishing photos and teaching photo workshops since 1984. He specializes in birds, butterflies, dragonflies, panoramic, and backyard habitats. His work has been published in Audubon, Birds & Blooms, National Wildlife, National Geographic and many other nature-related publications, calendars, and books worldwide. Richard leads photo tours, teaches butterfly and dragonfly workshops, and was a guide for Frontiers North to photograph polar bears in Churchill, Manitoba for 14 vears.

A former pilot, Richard has always been intrigued with things with wings but began photographing with drones in 2017 when a friend loaned him his drone to see if he liked it. He did—and as the saying goes, the rest is history. He now owns a Phantom 4Pro and is an FAA Certified Drone Pilot.

Richard and Susan Day own Daybreak Imagery, a stock photography and writing business, near Alma, Illinois. The Days present numerous programs throughout the country each year on backyard wildlife, nature photography, and the photo business.
