- Resize your images so vertical images are 1,800 pixels high and horizontal images are 1,800 pixels wide.
- Name your images according to the directions at monep.org under tips.
- Save your images as .jpg files.
- Compress your five resized images into a zip file.
- Attach the zip file to an email addressed to share@monep.org by midnight Saturday, March 16th for the March meeting and April 13th for the April meeting.

May 21st Meeting – Lonnie Gatlin

Lonnie Gatlin will present her program, *Chasing the Milky Way - Landscape Photography at Night* during the May meeting. From Death Valley National Park to here in Missouri and Illinois, landscape photographer Lonnie shares her experiences and lessons learned from photographing the night sky. You will learn about the tools, techniques, and processing used to reproduce beautiful starry-night landscapes as well as the emotions experienced. Her presentation is sure to include beneficial tips for all levels of photographers.

Lonnie is an award-winning photographer with more than 30 years of experience. Professionally, she has served as a writer, photojournalist, and bio-medical photographer in the St. Louis area. Today, Lonnie is best known for her astrophotography landscapes, chasing the light throughout the U.S. She is a frequent speaker on astrophotography at local camera clubs and recently started teaching astrophotography and light painting classes at Shaw Nature Reserve. She writes: My adventures in nightscape photography began in 2012 under master landscape photographer Marc Adamus. In 2015, I further pursued my passion for astrophotography with Adam Woodworth. Adam's photos and techniques have been featured in *Outdoor Photographer* and used by Nikon USA. She enthusiastically shares her passion.

June 18th Meeting – Doug Ladd

What's So Special About Orchids? Find out when Doug Ladd answers this question at the June MoNEP meeting. Wild orchids always generate excitement, yet most people don't know the background story behind these unique wildflowers. We'll explore the orchid world, and some amazing traits of these specialized plants, including some of the mean tricks they play on some animals. Doug will also take us on a tour of Missouri's wild orchids.

Doug is Conservation Biologist for The Nature Conservancy in Missouri. He has been involved with fire management and fire ecology, conservation planning, natural area assessment, and ecological management, restoration, and research for more than 35 years. His work has had an emphasis on vegetation, floristics, ecological restoration, lichens, and fire ecology. A research associate at the Missouri Botanical Garden, The Morton Arboretum, and the Conservation Research Institute, he also teaches graduate courses at Washington University.
