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
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2024 HOLIDAY SHOW

2025 MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS



Tuesday, January 21st Meeting – Charles Needle via Zoom, at 6:45 p.m. Topic: Creative Macro Photography

Join us on Tuesday, January 21st at 6:45 p.m. for a presentation with Charles Needle via Zoom. Learn how to create unusual and striking close-up images both in the field and in your own backyard and/or home studio.



Award-winning fine art photographer and workshop leader, Charles Needle, will guide us through all the necessary steps to take your macro photography to the next level. This session covers more advanced topics, such as selective-focus macro, "shooting through" with a telephoto lens, close-up lenses/diopters, artistic macro with Lensbaby and Kaleidoscopic lenses, Soft-Glow Montage macro, and wide-angle macro. Charles will also discuss specific methods for shooting water droplets, reflections on iridescent glass, mylar, and everyday household objects.

Charles Needle is also an author, speaker, and workshop leader with a unique eye for design and artistic interpretation. His popular Art of Nature creative macro workshops have attracted students nationwide.

In 2024, Charles made the shortlist for the Close-up Photographer of the Year international contest. In 2018 and 2021, he earned honorable mentions in the Macro and Visual FX categories of the prestigious Annual International Mobile Photography Awards Contest. Charles was also a semi-finalist in the 2014 Nature's Best Photography Windland Smith Rice International Awards photo contest. Charles is a North American Nature Photography Association (NANPA) Showcase Award winner for 18 years in a row, and placed in the Top Ten and Top 26 image categories three of those years.

A popular conference and camera club speaker for more than two decades, Charles has authored three cutting-edge instructional books: *Tiny Worlds: Creative Macro Photography Skills* (Amherst Media, January 2015), *Impressionistic Photography: A Field Guide to Using Your Camera as a Paintbrush* (March 2014), and *Creative Macro Photography: Professional Tips & Techniques* (2011).

Charles' photographs have been selected for publication in *Nature's Best, Outdoor Photographer* magazine, *Nature Photographer* magazine, *Inner Reflections* Engagement Calendar, *The Chicago Tribune*, *SELF* Magazine and are in private and public collections nationwide and abroad.

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SHOW & SHARE

Members are invited to share up to five (5) nature-related images during the January and February meetings.

- Images do not have to be recent.
- Images are due by midnight the Saturday before the meeting.

Please follow the submission and file naming guidelines below to submit images for Show and Share:

- Resize your images so vertical images are 1,800 pixels high and horizontal images are 1,800 pixels wide.
- Name your images using your last name then first name and the year and month of submission as well as the subject. For example, SmithJane-2025-01-Subject. No spaces please! If you would like your images shown in a particular order, please number them 1-5 after the subject.
- Save your images as .jpg files. Your saved images should be less than 4 MB in size.
- Compress your five resized images into a zip file. (If you don't know how to do this step, just send them as they are)
- Attach the zip file or images to an email addressed to share@monep.org by midnight Saturday, January 18th for the January meeting, or Saturday, February 15th for the February meeting.

The mission of the Missouri Nature and Environmental Photographers is to provide a forum for individuals interested in the field of nature photography and the environment, provide education, gather and disseminate information, and promote nature photography as an art form and medium of communication.
