November 15th Meeting - Missouri Waterfowl with Bill Rowe

Bill Rowe, the President of *St. Louis Audubon Society*, will be our presenter at the November meeting. He will share an introduction to the many kinds of waterfowl (ducks, geese, and swans) that can be found in Missouri, from the commonest to the rarest, including how to identify them on the water and how to distinguish the common ones in flight. Waterfowl are an ever-popular subject for MONEP photographers, so this should be a particularly interesting program for our members.

Kentucky. He attended Thomas Jefferson School in St. Louis for three years, then Wesleyan University (B.A.), and later Washington University (M.A.). He was a teacher at Thomas Jefferson School for 44 years, also serving as admission director and then Head of School from 2000-2011, followed by an additional four years of work in other independent schools.

Bill has always been interested in nature, especially birds. For many years he taught classes on birding for the *Missouri Botanical Garden*; he has led birding tours around North America and has served on the Missouri Bird Records Committee. Bill lives in St. Louis County with his wife Margaret. Their three children and two grandchildren all live in the St. Louis area too.

Members are invited to share up to five (5) nature-related images at the November meeting. Images do not have to be recent and you do not have to talk about your images.

Please follow the submission and file naming guidelines below to submit images for Show and Share:

- Resize your images so vertical images are 1,800 pixels high and horizontal images are 1,800 pixels wide.
- Name your images using your last name then first name and the year and month of submission as well as the subject. For example, SmithJane-2022-11-Subject. No spaces please! If you would like your images shown in a particular order, please number them 1-5 after the subject.
- Save your images as .jpg files. Your saved images should be less than 4 MB in size.
- Compress your five resized images into a zip file. (If you don't know how to do this step, just send them as they are)
- Attach the zip file or images to an email addressed to share@monep.org by midnight Saturday, November 12th.
