January Meeting – Bird Photography with Ruth Hoyt

Join us on Tuesday, January 19th via Zoom when MONEP founder and past president, Ruth Hoyt, presents a brand-new program for our 25th anniversary meeting and celebration. She will share an overview of how her nature photography has evolved over the past 25 years, with particular focus on birds, her current specialty. She hopes you will enjoy her stories and learn a little bit about birds.

Ruth is a full-time professional nature photographer, writer, public speaker, workshop leader, coach and consultant. She has 30+ years of experience teaching nature photography and is a Certified Interpretive Guide (national certification) and Certified Texas Master Naturalist (certified annually through Texas Parks & Wildlife since 2009). She is best known for her Texas bird photography and professional guiding services on private south Texas ranches, but she also pursues landscape, flora, macro, night and much more in various locations across the United States.

Ruth used her Canon 1DX Mark III DSLR for most of her work until recently when she purchased a new Canon R5 mirrorless camera. She uses an iPhone X and DJI Phantom 4 drone for video and still work for selected subjects.

Her work includes large canvas gallery-wrapped prints as well as mounted prints using archival, museum-quality paper. Her work can be seen in permanent public locations in various states as well as local hospitals, private offices and visitors' centers. February Meeting - Noah Buchanan on Mirrorless Cameras

On February 16th, Noah Buchanan of Hunt's Photo and Video will present a Zoom program on mirrorless cameras. Noah will discuss the pros and cons of mirrorless cameras as well as clear up misconceptions that are commonly held about them. The program will compare mirrorless cameras to DSLRs. He will explain the cameras' electronic viewfinders and cover lens options as well as talk about the adaptability of old lenses and different mounts. Other topics that Noah will cover include in-body stabilization and entry level and professional level options.



Show & Share Returns

We are happy to announce that we are resurrecting Show and Share during our meetings starting with our meeting on January 19th. Show and Share will come after the presentation during our Zoom meetings. Submissions are due by midnight on the Saturday prior to each month's meeting. See the dates below.

Members are invited to share up to five (5) nature-related images at the upcoming meetings. To submit for Show and Share:

- Resize your images so vertical images are 1,800 pixels high and horizontal images are 1,800 pixels wide.
- Name your images using your last name and the year and month of submission. For example, Smith 2021-01 for submission for the January 2021 Show and Share. You can then add a number or name describing each image, e.g. Smith 2021-01-Heron. If you do not name your image, then you may number them one to five, such as Smith 2021-01-1.
- Save your images as .jpg files.
- Compress your five resized images into a zip file.
- Attach the zip file to an email addressed to share@monep.org by midnight Saturday, January 16th for the January meeting and Saturday, February 13th for the February meeting.
